



Saskatchewan Jurisdictional Update

Ministry of Highways



Saskatchewan's road network is the largest in Canada on a per capita basis.

- Saskatchewan is a land-locked province, which relies heavily on the trucking industry to move goods to market.
- The network consists of 26,455 km of provincial highways.

Saskatchewan is in the fourth year of the 10-year goal to improve 10,000 km of highways.

In 2023-24, we will

- Invest \$422 million for over 1,000 km of capital improvements bringing the total to 4,600 km in the fourth year
- Deliver 870 km of capital pavement preservation to improve road conditions.
- Deliver 115 km of Thin Membrane Surface and rural highway upgrades.



Saskatchewan is in the fourth year of the 10-year goal to improve 10,000 km of highways.

In 2023-24, we will

- Rebuild or replace 14 bridges and multiple culverts.
- Support the expansion of forestry sector through gravel preservation and right of way maintenance in Northern Saskatchewan.

Saskatchewan committed \$100M over 5-years (starting 2019-20) to improve highway safety across the province.

- The ministry will spend approximately \$118.0M on 1,428 safety projects across the province during the 5-year initiative.
- The ministry has reviewed the sight lines at every highway-to-highway intersection and has addressed 63% of obstructed sight triangles.



The ministry is working with key industry stakeholders to identify opportunities for truck pull-outs.

- Areas underserved by commercial rest stops.
- Identified sites on several corridors on the provincial highway network.
- Developing plans for these sites for a pilot to determine the layout, land requirements, functionality, and costs.



Saskatchewan General Insurance is upgrading its permitting system.

- Request for Proposals posted.
- End to end solution for permit issuance, administration, automated routing, and restriction management.
- Assist carriers to plan their routes
- Increase the number of online self-issue customers
- Increase efficiencies in permit processes and approvals
