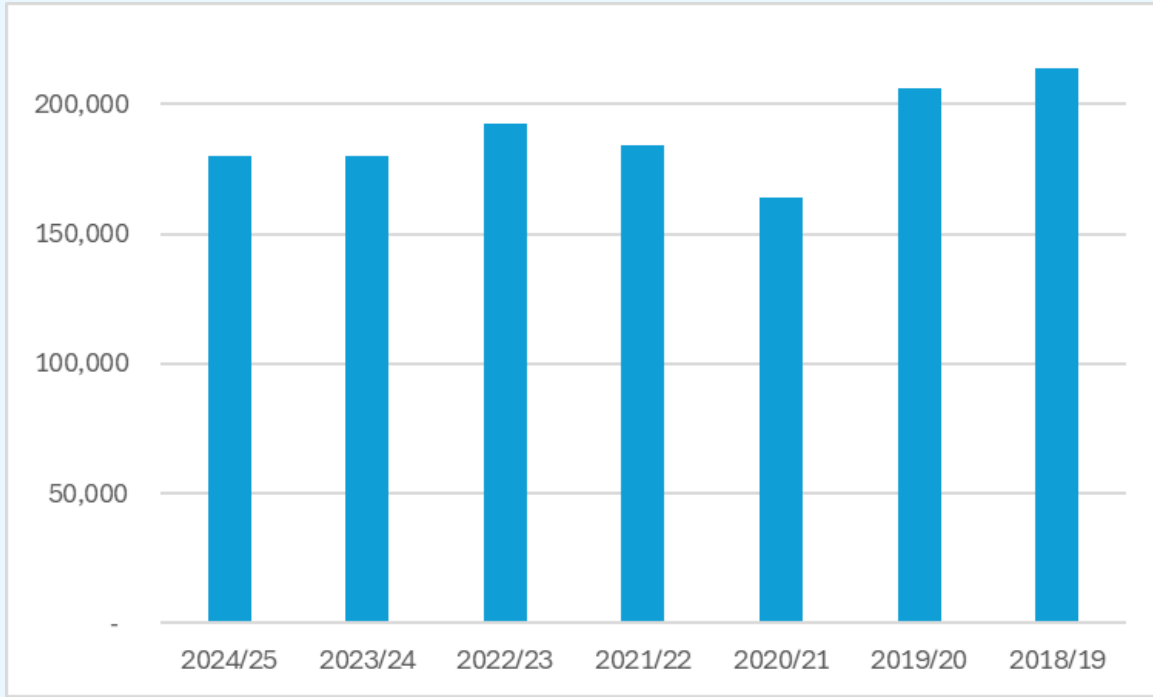
Motor Vehicle Modernization

- The Government of Alberta has committed to replace legacy technology applications that support Alberta's motor vehicle ecosystem.
- Multi-year, multi-stakeholder initiative will focus on modernizing over 500 motor vehicle services offered in Alberta.
- Entered into a shared-source model with Arizona for the use of the motor vehicle system (MAX).
- Moving towards a Spring 2028 implementation date.

TRAVIS Modernization

- The Transportation Routing and Vehicle Information System (TAVIS) offers a one-stop-shop for carriers to apply/receive permits for overweight/oversize loads.
- TRAVIS coordinates across municipalities to ensure carriers do not have to apply for multiple permits when travelling across Alberta.
- 90% of Alberta municipalities use the system to collect revenue and approve permits.
- Modernization efforts are underway to ensure the TRAVIS system continues to provide reliable service.
- Currently being evaluated to determine how it can be incorporated into MAX.

Alberta Permit Stats



- Average 190K/year.
- 30-35% of those permits are auto approved through TRAVIS.
- Most of the permits not auto-approved are issued within 1 business day.

Permit Fees



April 2025, permit fees increased by **25%**.



Apply to fixed fees, axle weight fees and gross vehicle weight fees.



Fees had not changed since the early 2000s.

Superloads



- Alberta classifies a “superload” as anything over than 300T.
- There are an average of 30 superloads each year.

Heaviest Move to Date

- **Gross Vehicle Weight:** 1.6 million kg
- **Equipment:** 26 Line double-wide conventional platform trailers
- **Wheels:** 842 wheels total
- **Dimensions:** 9.8m wide, 9.3m high, 140m long
- **Support Vehicles:** 2 Pull Trucks, 6 Push Trucks
- **Overall Length:** 230m (including support vehicles)



Reactor Move

Pre-approval: Started in 2022, prior to manufacture.

Trip Duration: 3 days to move 135km.

Travel Speed: Max 60km/hr.

Inspections: Pre/Post trip pavement inspections

Canadian Trucking Hub

- Alberta has developed a web portal that aims to assist carriers with comparing regulatory requirements across jurisdictions, access to online permit applications, and permit office resources across Canada.
- Provinces and territories are just getting access to the Hub prototype so they can begin to verify their data and provide feedback.
- Plan to launch late Spring 2026.

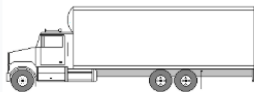

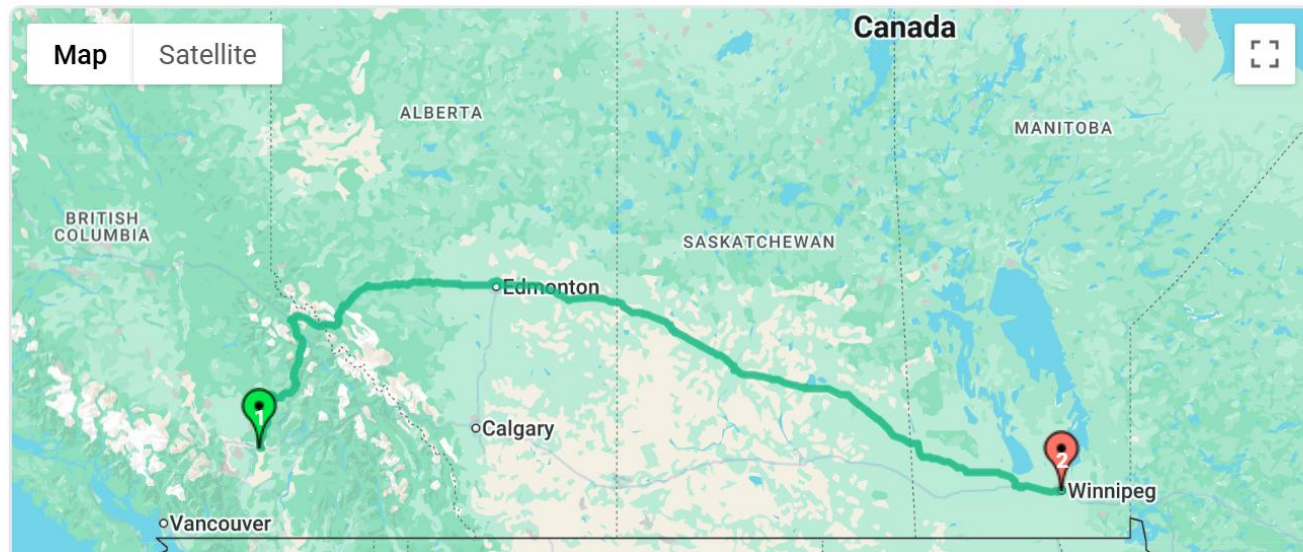
